#### **Final Win at Home**

In front of 9,299 fans, the Boston Cannons beat the Long Island Lizards in their final home game of the 2007 season by score of 17-16. The win improved the Cannons to 5-6 and drops Long Island to 4-7.

#### **Powell- Bud Light MVP**

Mike Powell received Bud Light MVP honors following Game 11 against Long Island. Powell scored 3 goals in the first quarter, and added 3 assists.

#### **Top Goal Scorers vs. Lizards**

Matt Poskay scored the most Cannons goals against Long Island with 4. Powell and Christmas both scored 3 goals, Zummo and Andrzejewski both scored 2 goals, and Bucktooth, Dougherty, and DeFelice each scored 1 goal.

#### **Cannons Behind the Two-Point Arc:**

Only two Cannons have scored from behind the two-point arc so far on the Cannon's 2007 regular season. John Christmas & Joe Kostolanski have each scored one 2-pointer, both in Game 6 against Washington. Matt Poskay also netted one from behind the arc in the 2007 MLL All-Star Game. In the 2006 season, five Cannons players scored 11 2-point-goals in the regular season. All five of those players are no longer on the Cannons team.

#### **Turner's Major League Debut**

Kip Turner earned the win in his second game as member of the Boston Cannons in game 11. As relief for Jake Coon, Turner had 7 saves on 12 shots and earned 5 goals against. He also played at Chicago in game 9 where the Cannons lost 19-18. Turner is 1-1 on the season.

#### **Newcomers Coming Up Big**

In their Cannons debuts, Kevin Dougherty scored 2 goals and Tom Zummo scored 1 goal. After 3 games played, Dougherty has earned 3 goals, and Zummo has earned 5 goals and 2 assists.

#### **Cannons & Lizards Lead Scorers**

Two Rochester players and two Cannons players make up 6 of the MLL players ranked top 5 in points scored. John Grant Jr. leads the league in points with 61. Powell is ranked 4th in points with 45. John Christmas is tied with Rochester's Jeff Zywicki with 43 total points each.

#### **Game 12 vs. Rochester**

This week's game marks the final game of the season for the Boston Cannons. For the first time in franchise history the Cannons will not participate in the playoffs for a shot at the Championship. Boston hopes to even out their record at 6-6 against Rochester, who is 8-3 on the season.

#### **Game 10 vs. Rochester**

The Boston Cannons faced the Rochester Rattlers at Harvard in Game 10 on July 19. The Cannons lost to Rochester 17-11 with 4 goals from Christmas, 2 goals from Powell, Poskay, and Zummo, and 1 goal from Chris Mucciolo. Rochester's Joe Walters earned MVP with 5 goals Gavin Prout and Jeff Zywicki both had 3 goals a piece.

#### **Rattlers' Leading Man**

Attackman John Grant Jr. from the Rochester Rattlers is the league leader in both goals and points. Grant has

scored 37 goals, 2 2pt. goals, and 22 assists for 61 total points. He scored a season high 14 points at Denver on June 16 when he tallied 8 goals, 1 two-point goal and 4 assists.

**Ground Balls**

Rochester’s defenseman Brodie Merrill leads league in ground balls with 90, while Boston’s Dave Jenkins is ranked 2nd with 71.

**Face-Offs**

Rochester’s main face-off man Alex Smith has won 171 of 297 at the X this season. Boston’s Dave Jenkins has earned 140 face-off wins of 277 taken.

**Rattlers Win 8 Straight**

Rochester is tied with Philadelphia to lead the Eastern Conference with a record of 8-3, and had won a franchise record 8 straight games before losing to New Jersey 13-12 in last week’s game 11.

**Casey Powell Returns**

Casey Powell returned to the lineup from the injured reserve list and collected one goal and three assists against Denver. His first assist of the game was his 200th point as a Rattler. Powell had missed the prior four games with an injury. He now has 13 goals and 20 assists for 33 points this season.

**Boston vs. Rochester in 2006**

In 2006, Boston beat Rochester by 1 pt at home (13-12), lost to them on the road (13-19).

**Championship Weekend in Rochester**

The 2007 New Balance Major League Lacrosse Championship Weekend will take place at PAETEC Park in Rochester on August 25th and 26th. The semifinal games will be held at 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 25th. The two semifinal winners will advance to the New Balance Championship Game on Sunday, August 26th. The Championship Game will air live on ESPN2 at 1:00 p.m.

From the start it was Mike Powell's game. Playing his most aggressive and his best overall game as a member of the Cannons Powell scored three times, handed out four

**Boston vs. Washington  
June 15, 2007**

In front 9,326 fans the Boston Cannons blew past the Washington Bayhawks for the second time this season 19-11. Along with an onslaught of offense early it was Jake Coon’s steady play in net that led the Cannons to the win and earned Coon Bud Light MVP honors. Coon made 23 saves helping Boston to its second straight home win.

“Our defense played a heck of a game,” said Coon. “Those guys did an amazing job in front of me shutting down shooting lanes. Washington is a very good team but we played with an edge defensively.”

It was the Cannons night offensively from the start. Boston scored the game’s first five points and shut out Washington 5-0 in the first quarter. Mike Powell netted two of his game-high four goals in the first quarter, adding in assist in the first as well.

“When our offense plays the way we did in the first quarter we are dangerous,” said Powell. “We’re at our best when we’re getting everyone involved, moving the ball and using our quickness. We did that for most of the game but especially early.”

The Cannons six point first quarter outburst was punctuated by Joe Kostolansky’s two-point goal 4:04 into the quarter. It was the Cannons first “deuce” of the season. John Christmas netted another “two” 6:41 into the second quarter.

The Bayhawks found the net in the second quarter scoring six times. Boston was able to match Washington’s rebirth offensively, closing the second quarter with two Ben DeFelice goals. DeFelice, known primarily as a defensive midfielder had his best game as a member of the Cannons finishing with 2 goals and 2 assists. Boston led 12-6 at the half.

After a first half that saw a total of only two penalties for one total minute, the second half brought a deluge of yellow flags. The second half featured 16 penalties for a

total of 16.5 penalty minutes, including the ejection of Tom Marechek for arguing with the official.

With the myriad of penalties, the scoring slowed. Boston scored the first three goals of the second half. Powell finished the first one, followed by DJ Andrzejewski and David Mitchell.

The Bayhawks went on a 5-0 run from the end of the third quarter to midway through the fourth quarter. Boston countered with two straight late goals from Ryan Danehy and Brett Bucktooth respectively.

Powell led the way for Boston with 4 goals and 2 assists. Christmas, DeFelice, Mitchell and Bucktooth each netted two goals for the Cannons.

Conor Gill making his return to Boston finished with 1 assist. Chris Garrity made his return to the tune of 18 saves.

The Cannons record improves to 3-3 while the Bayhawks drop to 4-2.

**Boston vs. New Jersey  
June 23, 2007**

The Boston Cannons fell to the New Jersey Pride 13-10 in front of 9,154 fans at Harvard Stadium. Pride attackman Conor Ford led the way and was named Bud Light MVP. He finished with five goals. The loss drops the Cannons record to 3-4 while the Pride improve to 2-4. Jesse Hubbard netted three for New Jersey.

## **Boston @ New Jersey June 30, 2007**

The Boston Cannons travel to New Jersey and take care of business beating the Pride 16-13 in an important midseason contest. Brett Bucktooth returned to action with a monster game scoring 6 goals and adding an assist for 7 total points to earn Bud Light MVP honors. The win improves the Cannons to 4 and 4 and creates a log jam in the MLL's Eastern Conference standings.

"We approached this as a must win," said Bill Daye, Cannons head coach. "We needed this game to keep the playoffs a reality. Our goal was to play smarter and crisper than we did a week ago. We thought if we did that we'd have a good chance to get the win. Give all the credit in the world to our players because they played exactly the way we needed to."
